CLOTHING & BELONGINGS

READING



Please can I ask that all parents and carers support with reading at home, as much as possible. The class teams here work really hard on reading at school - whole class reading, 1:1 reads, phonics, story time, talking about books, and much more.

We really need your support with reading at home. All children should be reading at home at least 4 times per week. More is preferable!

Please fill in your child's reading record so we know they are reading at home. Thank you.

ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

Thank you to everyone for ensuring your children are here, on time, every day when it is possible. I am aware there are a few nasty bugs going around at the moment, and that illness cannot be helped.

I am required to investigate any attendance which falls below 90%, which is why some of you might have recently received a letter from me. Thank you to those of you who have got in touch to explain why this may be.

So you are aware, the register closes at 8:45am. If your child arrives at school after this time then their lateness is marked as an absence. This is how all schools are required to mark attendance.

SCHOOL VISION

At Hamsey we regularly talk about our school vision and about what makes us special. As you know, in our Friday celebration assemblies the children receive a kindness and a creativity certificate each week.

Kindness - All adults at Hamsey keep this at the centre of what we do. We want to instill this in all the children.

Creativity - We talk about creativity not just being linked to art, but in all that we do here. The children can be creative thinkers in maths, they can use creative langauge in English, they can play creatively outside.

Adventures - Every day is an advenure at Hamsey! We want our children to see their school journey as one that is filled with adventures, both in and out of the classroom.




FOXES CLASS

Her talk about tsunamis, earthquakes and volcanoes was a fascinating way to start our 'Explore: Danger' project. Our Year 3s have begun their Forest School adventure and our Year 4s have begun their swimming lessons. We recently had a special talk about energy from Chartwells, and we have also had our first Music Workshop with Miss Berry!

In class we have been learning about the water cycle and have created or own mini water worlds where we are growing cress and investigating the water cycle process. We hope they grow! Please do pop in to see our wonderful work if you have a moment at the end of the day.













As part of our DANGER! project, Owls Class were visited by Cath Reed, our local Community Rail Officer, who led a workshop on 'Safe Travel'. The children learnt a lot about the dangers associated with the railway and all the different things they should do to stay safe. Cath was impressed with how inquisitive the children were and how maturely they handeled the more difficult aspects of this topic. We hope that this workshop was particuarly beneficial to some of our Y6 children who will be using the train to travel to secondary school next year. Cath will be returning in the summer term to help the children plan and take a train journey!

We visited Cumnor House Science department to take part in a 'Crime Scene Investigation' challenge. The children had the opportunity to use lots of scientific testing techniques to work out who had stolen the biscuits! They really enjoyed working with the scientific equipment and chemicals on offer. The children all demonstrated excellent pro-social learning behaviours throughout and their politeness and attentiveness was noted by the teaching staff. Well done Owls!

After a very patient wait, Mila, Primrose and Nao were finally awarded the longawaited trophy for their winning entry in the ROAR 2022 competition! We were delighted to be visited by members of The Lions Club to present the award.
