### **SCARLET FEVER & STREP A**

You will have heard in the news about the rise in cases of Scarlet Fever and Strep A. Please be very vigilant and get your child checked by a doctor if you have any worries. If antibiotics are started early, infection can be minimised.

To keep everyone else in the school safe, please do not send in your child if they have any of the symptoms and have not yet been checked by a doctor:

- Sore throat
- Headache
- Fever
- A fine, pinkish or red body rash with a sandpapery feel
- On darker skin the rash can be more difficult to detect visually but will have a sandpapery feel

In our science sessions we have been exploring our five senses and which body part is associated with each sense. The children took part in a special taste test with our school fruit snacks. They were challenged to see if their sense of taste changed if they shut their eyes and pinched their nose!

We are delighted to announce that our Hamsey team won FIRST PLACE in the national finals of ROAR 2022, representing the southeast region! The children competed against 25,000 children at over 100 other schools - an *amazing* achievement!

Owls pupils, Primrose, Mila and Nao created the design, prototype, and sales pitch for 'The Green Machine', a solar-powered device that purifies dirty water into drinking water. The judges at 8Billionideas were particularly impressed that the group had chosen to solve a current global issue. Owls Class, along with Primrose, Mila and Nao's parents, joined the live final via Zoom where the winning schools were announced - it was a truly joyful moment!

As well as medals and a trophy (to be presented next term by members of The Lions Club) the team has won free access to the 8Billionideas platform - a digital platform with courses, live sessions, and dedicated mentors to equip students with the entrepreneurial skills for tomorrow. We look forward to their future creations!
