














HEDGEHOGS CLASS





Welcome back to Term 5! We have had a great first week back and it has been lovely to hear all about the Easter holiday adventures. Everyone had a great time at Drusillas and enjoyed the experience.

This week we have been looking at our new text, 'Handa's Surprise'. We have talked about lots of different types of fruit and which are our favourites - this has led to conversations around healthy eating and what we can do to keep healthy. We have got stuck into our Create project, and been experimenting with colour mixing and seeing different variations of colours that can be made.









FOXES CLASS



Foxes Class have had a wonderful start to the summer term. The children all enjoyed their trip to Drusillas Park and were thrilled to discover more about dangerous animals in their 'Deadly Creatures' workshop. We loved having you visit for our end of term exhibition and here are some pictures of our wonderful clay elephants that we created.

We are thoroughly looking forward to creating some more incredible artwork as part of Create: Still Life project and we will invite you in again to see our amazing sketchbooks and final pieces.









OWLS CLASS





Owls jumped straight into their Create project by reflecting on questions related to this term's key concepts: Pride, Passion and Dreams. These included: What do you see in art that represents your dreams? How do artists convey passion through art? How do artists show that they are proud of their work? Why is representation so important in art?

We then went on to look at Kandinsky's Colour Theory and learnt about synesthesia. The children decided which colours on a colour wheel they felt most represented different emotions to them. Then we listened to lots of different instruments - some very unusual! We discussed the different timbres of the instruments and the children then matched each instrument to their colour wheel. Lots of lovely self-reflection and self- expression.

Well done to Year 6 for coming back to Term 5 with so much enthusiasm for your SATS learning. We are immensely proud of how hard you are working at SATS Club and in all the preparation we are doing in class. Keep up the good work!











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
