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Statement of Behaviour Principles

Principles

The Governors of Hamsey Primary School believe that high standards of behaviour lie at the heart of a successful school. A successful school enables all of its pupils to make the best possible progress in all aspects of school life and work, and enables its staff to be able to teach and promote good learning without undue interruption or harassment.

All pupils and staff have the right to feel safe at all times. There should be mutual respect between staff and pupils, and between pupils. All visitors to the school should feel safe and free from the effects of poor behaviour at all times and in all parts of the school.

Hamsey Primary School is an inclusive school. All members of the school community should be free from discrimination of any sort (as laid down in the Equality Act, 2010). The school has a clear and comprehensive Anti-Bullying Policy.

Parents and carers should be encouraged and helped to support their children's education. Parents should be helped to understand their responsibilities during their time at school, in the local community and in preparation for their life after school. Responsibilities must be outlined in the Home School Agreement which parents and carers must be asked to sign when a pupil joins the school.

Expected standards of behaviour are clearly stated in the school's Behaviour Policy. The school will treat all children fairly and apply this policy in a consistent way.
