FOREST SCHOOL



Wow it's been a chilly one! We've certainly tested our resilience this half term at Forest School. Thank you for sending the children in with plenty of warm layers and waterproofs which has enabled them to get the most out of their sessions. Thankfully, the cold weather has given us a good excuse to get the fire on and warm up!

We all took part in the Big School Bird Watch in our first session; supporting the important work of the RSPB as we built bird hides and made bird feeders before retreating into our hides to observe with binoculars and spotting sheets. We've also been busy planting daffodil bulbs and look forward to seeing these grow.

Across the year groups, children have had an opportunity to work with a bow saw, using it safely in pairs to saw wood and communicate with a team mate to turn wooden cylinders into cubes to make dice with knives and mallets. Then we've made elder beads for necklaces and bark boats, done plenty of den building and explored ice, lots of mud and of course our 'Danger' project through fire safety, tool work and taking managed risks whilst considering our 'personal responsibility'.

Badgers children went to Chailey Common, where we were lucky enough to work with the Sussex Wildlife Trust, supporting with some local conservation work, coppicing, sawing and building leaky dams to slow the flow of water through the Ouse catchment. We had a fabulous day working hard - it certainly made our packed lunches taste good!


HEDGEHOGS CLASS



We have had a lovely term exploring different stories recently. We really liked 'Tea Rex' and designing the dinosaur a menu to enjoy. Year 1s have had great fun exploring animals and their habitats and even designing their own animal to survive in the arctic. Reception have continued to explore the natural world during Forest School, experimenting with different games and tools in the wild and having great fun splashing in muddy puddles!

We explored Valentines Day and talked about people in our lives who we love and how we can show this. We used loose parts to make hearts, wrote our own love recipes and made cards with lots of glitter. We produced some fantastic independent writing.









FOXES CLASS



Foxes have been explorers in our Geography-based project this term. We have visited Africa, Antarctica, The Arctic and South America! We have learnt about different climate zones and the small changes we can make to protect animals and the environment.

In Art, we have explored the work of Edvard Munch, looking at his famous piece, 'The Scream'. We have worked on our sketching skills and used our analysis ideas to say what we like and dislike about an artwork.









BADGERS CLASS



Badgers have had an adventurous end to Term 3. We went to Chailey Common where we became Explorers, Eco-Warriors and beavers! Our mission was to save the heather plant in the environment by cutting down birch trees that were growing in the way and using this wood to create dams in the nearby stream to slow down the water flow.

We had to be careful and wear protective gloves because there was DANGER – we used saws and loppers to cut down the trees and strip away the small twigs. We learnt that beavers would have previously completed the job that we had to do but there aren't any in this environment currently. Maybe some will be introduced again into the environment in the future... We wish you all a fantastic half term holiday and if you have time do go to Chailey Common - Romany Ridge area to look at the dams we made.









OWLS CLASS



Last Friday, Mr Everitt led the class through lots of Maths challenges for NSPCC Numbers Day. Thank you to the children who created outfits with numbers for the day! We have really enjoyed taking part in PSHE activities for Children's Mental Health Week, with a focus on staying connected to each other.

It has been such a pleasure to teach the children how to sew as part of their DT work this term. The children analysed soft toy designs and then designed and made their own, including making a sewing pattern and selecting materials.
