Maths Week was held in March and the children looked at the work of the artist Wassily Kandinsky, and how he used shape in his paintings.

Our Owls and Foxes are very proud of the submission that they have made to the Towner Art Gallery's Draw Me in Schools' Exhibition. This opens to the public on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> April and showcases the work of around fifty East Sussex schools and educational groups. It is free to enter and we recommend a visit during the Easter holidays!

This term has been a busy time for sport at Hamsey. Our Year 2 footballers won the inaugural

Key Stage One Skylark Football Tournament. A lovely afternoon was had by all on Thursday 28th March-and the cakes were fantastic, too! Thank you to everyone who supported this event.

On Wednesday 20th March we sent a team of netballers and our football team to take part in the Key Stage Two Football and Netball Festival at Newick CE School. Our netballers were determined (particularly our stalwart defenders) and we came joint third overall. Our football team played extremely well and, deservedly, won the tournament.

Some of our pupils have been undertaking analysis air pollution around

Hamsey CP School. The levels of air pollution at the front of the school (on the road side) were approximately half of the minimum 'safe' amount set by the Government.

Air pollution at the rear side of the school (on our back field) was almost half the road side amount. We support the local community in their commitment to encourage car drivers to turn off their engines when waiting for the railway crossing to open.

Our Eco Council will be working with the local Parish Council to consider ways of raising awareness of this issue.



Hamsey raised money for Comic Relief and the children shared some good jokes. We are a small school and to raise almost £200 was a big achievement.

Our commitment to improve the attendance of our pupils Hamsey remains.

Our overall attendance from the start of the academic year until 1/4/19 is 94.4%. The DfE are concerned; this figure is 1.6% below their acceptable level for attendance which is 96%.
