Reading Matters at Hamsey School

We are reviewing our approach to reading at Hamsey School and we will be updating you regarding this at the start of next term. Please try to hear your child read every day, and encourage them to bring their book bags into school. This is very important if your child is a Hedgehog, a Fox or a Badger but the Owls need to be heard regularly, too.



If you have not yet had the chance to see Hamsey's work show on Eastbourne's Towner Art Gallery we recommend a visit. The Schools Exhibition is on until Sunday 2nd June and it is well worth a visit. It is free to get in and would make a lovely day out in the forthcoming week's holiday from school!

Punctuality—We want our children on time for school every day; punctuality matters in order that learning time is not

Also, we want our children collected promptly at the end of the school day. We understand that there may, occasionally, be a reason for children being collected late from school and we ask that you contact us so that we have an estimated time for collection. However, we are concerned that some of our children are being collected late regularly and this is not acceptable.

PE Sessions—Please ensure that your child has appropriate footwear for every PE session; it is so important that our children have the right kit for their sport sessions. If your child's hair needs to be tied up during PE sessions please ensure that they have a hair band with them in school. We want our children to be safe when they are doing PE.
